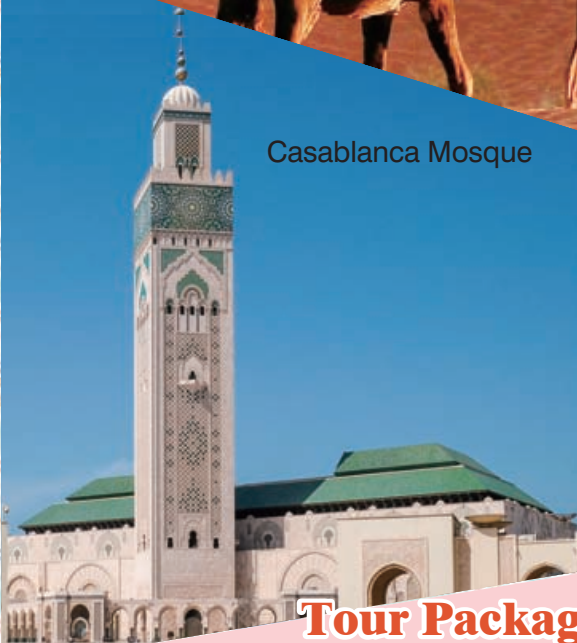

Optional: Day 1Feb 21**

Honolulu → Los Angeles

We start our vacation by boarding a domestic flight to Los Angeles and staying there overnight.

Day 2Feb 22**

Los Angeles → Paris → Marrakech

We start our vacation by boarding an international flight from Los Angeles to Marrakech via Paris. Overnight onboard.

Day 3 Feb 23**

Arrival Marrakech

Marrakech, a former imperial city in western Morocco, serves as a major economic center and is renowned for its mosques, palaces, and gardens. The medina, a densely packed, walled medieval city dating back to the Berber Empire, features maze-like alleys where vibrant souks (marketplaces) offer traditional textiles, pottery, and jewelry. Upon arrival in Marrakech, an Air & Sea Travel representative will greet us and escort us to our hotel.

Day 4 Feb 24**

Marrakech

(B, L, D)

After breakfast, we will begin our city tour in Marrakech. Our first stop will be the Koutoubia Mosque, the largest mosque in the city. Next, we will explore the Old Market and visit Jemaa el-Fnaa, a bustling square and marketplace in the medina quarter. This vibrant square remains the main hub of Marrakech, frequented by both locals and tourists. The market is a sensory feast, filled with the colors, smells, and sounds of snake charmers, local musicians, craft sellers, and spice merchants—a true mela every night. After lunch, we will enjoy a horse carriage ride through the medina quarter. Then, we will visit the Bahia Palace, a stunning late 19th-century palace that is now a well-known historic monument and tourist attraction. Finally, we will return to our hotel for dinner.

Day 5 Feb 25**

Marrakech – Ait Benhaddou – Ouarzazate

(B, L, D)

This morning, we will drive to Ouarzazate, a city located south of Morocco's High Atlas Mountains, known as the gateway to the Sahara Desert. Our journey will take us through the Tizi n'Tichka Pass, offering stunning views along the way. Our first stop will be the historic Kasbah Ait Ben Haddou, a fortified village (or ksar) that once served as a caravan route between the Sahara and Marrakech. This remarkable example of Moroccan earthen clay architecture has been a [UNESCO World Heritage Site](#) since 1987. In Ouarzazate, we will make a photo stop at the impressive Taourirt Kasbah, which features a 19th-century palace and offers breathtaking views of the rugged local landscape, famously depicted in several films. Next, we will visit the Atlas Movie Studio before transferring to our hotel.

Day 6 Feb 26**

Ouarzazate – Tinghir – Erfoud – Merzouga

(B, L, D)

This morning, we will continue our journey to Tinghir, a charming town renowned for its magnificent palm grove and the famous Todra Gorge, built in terraces around a promontory dominated by the ruins of an old Glaoui residence. We will visit the breathtaking Todra Gorge before proceeding to Merzouga, a small Moroccan town located in the Sahara Desert near the Algerian border. Merzouga is known as the gateway to Erg Chebbi, a vast expanse of sand dunes north of town, often described as "a desert theme park," with Erg Chebbi being referred to as "a wonderland of sand." Upon arrival, we will enjoy the stunning Sahara sunset. Tonight, we will stay in a deluxe tent at the desert camp, marking the highlight of our trip—the Sahara experience. Enjoy the evening and dinner under the stars.

Day 7 Feb 27**

Merzouga – Erfoud – Midelt – Ifrane – Fez

(B, L, D)

This morning, we will wake up early to experience a camel ride at sunrise from the top of the dunes. Afterward, we will pack up and leave following breakfast. On our journey, we will pass through Erfoud, Midelt, and Ifrane, towns located in Morocco's Middle Atlas Mountains, known for their alpine-style architecture and nearby ski slopes and forests. Our final destination is Fez, the spiritual heart of Morocco and the most ancient of the country's imperial cities. Upon arrival, we will check in to our hotel and enjoy dinner.

Day 8 Feb 28**

Fez

(B, L, D)

Today, we will discover the charm of Fez. Our first stop will be a photo opportunity at the Royal Palace (Dar El Makhzen). Although it is closed to the public, the palace is an impressive sight from the outside. Next, we

will explore the Medina, a [UNESCO World Heritage Site](#) and home to the oldest university in the world. The Medina of Fez is a true gem of Spanish-Arabic civilization. Following that, we will visit the Nejjarine Museum, a beautiful building dedicated to the arts of wood and woodworking. Then, we will explore the Bou Inania Medersa, which showcases classic Moroccan decorative styles, including zellij tilework, delicate stucco midriff, and a carved olivewood ceiling. Tonight, we will return to our hotel and enjoy dinner.

Day 9 Mar 1**

Fez – Chefchaouen

(B, L, D)

After breakfast, we will transfer to Chefchaouen, a city in the Rif Mountains of northwest Morocco, renowned for its striking blue-washed buildings in the old town. On our way, we will visit Meknes, known for its imperial past, highlighted by remnants such as Bab Mansour, a grand gate adorned with arches and mosaic tiling that leads into the former imperial city. We will also see the Arch of Caracalla, one of the most distinctive sights in Volubilis, located at the end of the city's main street, the Decumanus Maximus. Upon our arrival in Chefchaouen, we will enjoy dinner and check in to our hotel.

Day 10 Mar 2**

Chefchaouen – Rabat

(B, L, D)

After breakfast, we start our visits in Chefchaouen, includes Medina and Main Square, the mountainside old town area with homes, plazas & narrow alleyways painted in various shades of blue. Late afternoon, we will transfer to Rabat. After dinner, we will check-in to our hotel.

Day 11 Mar 3**

Rabat – Casablanca

(B, L, D)

Rabat has been Morocco's political and administrative capital since its independence in 1956. While it may not be a well-known tourist destination, those who visit find a hidden gem of a city. Our tour in this [UNESCO Heritage City](#) includes the Hassan Tower, whose construction began in 1195 and was intended to be the largest minaret in the world, as well as the nearby Mausoleum of Mohammed V, built in traditional Moroccan style, where the current king's father and grandfather are buried. We will also visit the Oudayas Kasbah, which translates to "fortress" in English. In the afternoon, we will head to Casablanca. This city is not only famous for the movie "Casablanca," but it also represents Morocco's dynamic progress. It is a hub of industry, art, and fashion, showcasing contemporary art in its galleries and providing a platform for fashion designers. Tonight, we will enjoy dinner at [Rick's Café Casablanca](#), a romantic eatery inspired by the café in the 1942 film "Casablanca," featuring cocktails and live piano music.

Day 12 Mar 4**

Casablanca

(B, L, D)

After breakfast, we will begin our sightseeing in Casablanca. Our first stop will be a photo opportunity at the Hassan II Mosque, built to commemorate the former king's 60th birthday. It is the largest mosque in Morocco and the seventh largest in the world, prominently situated on a promontory overlooking the Atlantic Ocean. Next, we will explore the Central Market and Habouss Quarter, the main shopping areas in the city, popular with tourists seeking souvenirs. Here, you can find traditional clothing, jewelry, antiques, rugs, and other local merchandise. After lunch, we will visit King Mohammed V Square, the central hub of Casablanca's new town, which features some of the city's most striking architecture. We will also make a photo stop at the Royal Palace, a masterpiece of Islamic architecture. Then, we will visit the Notre-Dame de Lourdes Church, a modernist Catholic church in Casablanca. To conclude our day, we will enjoy a farewell dinner featuring delicious food and a Moroccan belly dance show.

Day 13 Mar 5**

Casablanca → Los Angeles

(B)

Today we will say farewell to Casablanca and transfer to the airport for our return flight to Los Angeles. Transfer to hotel and stay overnight.

Optional: Day 14 Mar 6**

Los Angeles → Honolulu

Today, we will take a flight back to Honolulu, taking home lasting memories of this magnificent Morocco trip.
