**Day 1\*\*Oct 28**

**Honolulu → Narita**

We start our vacation to **Southeast Asia**. Start boarding an international flight bound for Narita Japan. Meals and snacks will be served on the plane.

**Day 2\*\*Oct 29**

**Narita → Bangkok**

Upon arrival at Bangkok airport, Air & Sea Travel representative will greet and escort us to our hotel. **Bangkok** is the capital and populous city of Thailand.

**Day 3\*\*Oct 30**

**Bangkok**

**(B, L)**

After breakfast, we have an all-day **Exciting Bangkok City Tour**. We will visit the most interesting parts of Bangkok, including stops at the **Temple of the Reclining Buddha (Wat Pho)**, famous as the oldest and largest temple in Bangkok; the **Grand Palace, Coronation Hall** and the holiest of all Thai Temples "**The Emerald Buddha Temple**" (**Wat Phra Kaew**) where the replica of Angkor Wat and the late Ayutthaya-style murals on the surrounding walls illustrate scenes from the Ramayana are included in the temple's compound. After enjoying lunch at a local restaurant, we will experience **Tuk Tuk on the Road**, the local Bangkok transportation. We will return to our hotel and enjoy the rest of day on our own.

**Day 4\*\*Oct 31**

**Bangkok**

**(B)**

After breakfast, we will visit **Maeklong Railway Market**, a unique market located directly on the railway just down the track from the train station of Maeklong. A 120 km drive to the most colorful **Floating Market** in Thailand passing the largest source of Salt Production along the roadside of the highway. At **Damnoen Saduak** we will see boat people sell their wares from boat to boat or boat to shore. We will ride on a **Long-tail boat ride**. We can enjoy our own lunch here. After that, we will go for a **Massage Treatment**. **Thai Massage** is a traditional therapy combining acupressure, Indian Ayurvedic principles, and assisted yoga postures. Let us enjoy a 120-minute massage. Tonight, we will have a chance to enjoy our own dinner. The night ends with a **Lady Boy Show** in Bangkok.

**Day 5\*\*Nov 1**

**Bangkok → Chiang Rai**

**(B, D)**

We will enjoy our free time in the morning, and then we will transfer to the airport and take the flight to **Chiang Rai**. Enjoy our **dinner** at the hotel.

**Day 6\*\*Nov 2**

**Chiang Rai**

**(B, L, D)**

After breakfast, we will visit **Longneck Karen Village**. Then, we will take our journey to **Mae Sai**, the northernmost city of Thailand bordering Myanmar. There are hundreds of open markets, where you can enjoy shopping or browsing. After lunch, we will continue to the **Golden Triangle**, the meeting point of Myanmar, Thailand, and Laos. It is well-known as the center for the opium trade. From here view the splendor of the mighty Mae Kong River joining the Ruak and forming the "triangle" with Laos, Burma and Thailand. After dinner, we will transfer back to our hotel.

**Day 7\*\*Nov 3**

**Chiang Rai – Chiang Mai**

**(B, L)**

Today, we will transfer to the border town of **Chiang Mai**. Our first stop will be **Maekhajan Hot Springs**, a good spot to take a morning cup of coffee where will stop to see the stunning **Wat Rong Khun**, frequently referred to as The White Temple. After lunch, we will continue to Chiang Mai. Tonight, let us visit a **local night market**. Chiang Mai Night Bazaar is one of Chiang Mai's biggest draws. The market attracts huge crowds every evening and it is a great place to pick up trinkets and gifts. Given the market's close proximity to the companies that manufacture them, the price of local handicrafts is attractively reasonable here. We can enjoy our dinner here.

**Day 8\*\*Nov 4**

**Chiang Mai**

**(B, L)**

Today's highlight is the visit to **Mae Ping Elephant Camp** to see the '**Elephants at Work**' Show. We have an opportunity to **Ride the Elephants** crossing the river and into the forest. Then return **By Oxcart** to the elephant village and enjoy a **Bamboo Rafting Adventure** on the river. On the way back to the hotel, drive to **Wat Banden**. This temple is surrounded by beautiful landscapes, the temple stands prominently on top of a small hill and can be easily seen from afar. Then, we will return to Chiang Mai after a full-day tour. Tonight, we can enjoy another night with dinner on our own. Let us try some local food. We can also do some shopping or massage on our own near the hotel.

**Day 9\*\*Nov 5**

**Chiang Mai → Kuala Lumpur**

**(B)**

Today, we will transfer to the airport and take the flight to **Kuala Lumpur**. Upon arrival, we will transfer to Kuala Lumpur and check in to our hotel.

**Day 10\*\*Nov 6**

**Day trip to Malacca**

**(B, L)**

After breakfast, we will transfer to **Malacca**, the oldest trading port in Malaysia which had undergone Portuguese, Dutch, and British rule. First, we will visit **St. Peter's Church** (1710) – the oldest Christian Church still in use in Malaysia. Drive past the largest **17th-century Chinese Cemetery** outside of China, located at Bukit China or Chinese Hill. Stop at the foothill to view the Sultan's well before driving through the Portuguese Settlement. Proceed to view the gateway, '**Port De Santiago**' and the **Ruins of St. Paul's Church** lined with 17th-century Dutch tombstones. Next, we will stop for our **Local Nyonya Lunch**. Next on the list is "**Red Square**" – the salmon-pink Dutch administrative buildings which today house the Malacca Museum and government offices. A **Trishaw ride** will be arranged, followed by a stroll along Malacca's **Jonker Street**, which ends by the banks of the Malacca River. Then, we will return to **Kuala Lumpur** and enjoy our own dinner.

**Day 11\*\*Nov 7**

**Kuala Lumpur**

**(B, D)**

After breakfast at the hotel, we will head to the **Batu Caves**, a massive limestone outcrop that lays across the scarred landscape of an old tin mine. At the base of the outcrop lies a small Hindu shrine displaying various Hindu deities. The Cathedral Cave, the largest and most popular cavern in Batu Caves is breathtaking with huge shafts of light streaking down from gaps in the roof of the cave and piercing the natural darkness of its interior. Then, we will return to the city and enjoy our own lunch in **Chinatown**. Then, we will take a grand city tour of Kuala Lumpur, with a photo stop at the **Istana Negara**. Built in 1857 and home to a Chinese merchant and his family, this mansion is now the official residence of the King of Malaysia. See the **Masjid Jamek**, the oldest mosque in the city built on the historical site where Kuala Lumpur derived its name. **Dataran Merdeka** is the site of the nation's historic Declaration of Independence. The area surrounding the square boasts unique Colonial Era Landmarks such as the Sultan Abdul Samad building and St. Mary's Anglican Church. Visit the **Royal Selangor**, the biggest, oldest, and most reputed pewter maker in the world since 1885. Pass **Embassy Row**, is known for its embassies and highly desirable residences such as the Sharif Ali Palace. Arrive at the Kuala Lumpur City Center, topped off by the stainless steel and glass complex of the **Twin Towers**, the world's tallest buildings at 405 meters. We will have the chance to visit the **observation deck**, where we can enjoy stunning views of the area. It's a perfect opportunity for taking photos and appreciating the scenery. After the tour, we will return to our hotel to enjoy a delicious dinner.

**Day 12\*\*Nov 8**

**Kuala Lumpur → Bali**

**(B, D)**

Upon arrival at **Ngurah Rai Airport**, Air & Sea Travel representative will greet and escort us to our hotel and enjoy **Barong and Keris Dance Performance with dinner**.

**Day 13\*\*Nov 9**

**Bali**

**(B, L, D)**

Today, we will start the tour to **Batuan Village** to visit the **Batuan Ancient Temple**. This temple is one of the pair located in Batuan Village and boasts over 1,000 years of history, making it one of the most ancient temple sites on the island. After lunch, we will head to **Tohpati Village**, an art and craft village renowned for its hand-woven batik. Here, we will participate in a **Batik Making Lesson**. Tohpati Village is famous for its high-quality batik, which is a significant aspect of Balinese culture. The technique involves creating intricate designs on fabric using wax. After this exciting experience, we will have dinner before returning to the hotel.

**Day 14\*\*Nov 10**

**Bali**

**(B, L, D)**

After breakfast, we will visit **Tanah Lot**, the iconic Sea Temple built on a barren rock by the ocean. The next stop is **Bedugul** with a beautiful panoramic view of **Bratan Lake** and **Ulun Danu Temple**. Water temples serve the entire region in the outflow area; there are many smaller water temples downstream that are specific to each irrigation association. After lunch, we will visit a **plantation** where we can see a variety of fresh fruits. It will be a great opportunity to experience the local agriculture and enjoy the vibrant surroundings. Tonight, we will return to Nusa Dua for dinner.

**Day 15\*\*Nov 11**

**Bali**

**(B)**

**Today, we will enjoy our free day in Bali.** Bali, the famed Island of the Gods, with its varied landscape of hills and mountains, rugged coastlines and sandy beaches, lush rice terraces and barren volcanic hillsides, all provide a picturesque backdrop to its colorful, deeply spiritual and unique culture.

**Day 16\*\*Nov 12**

**Bali → Singapore**

**(B)**

After breakfast, we will transfer to Bali airport and take the flight to Singapore. **Singapore** is a huge, modern, affluent city with skyscrapers, a subway system, a medley of Chinese, Malay and Indian influences, a tropical climate, tasty food, good shopping, and a vibrant nightlife scene. Upon arrival, we will have time to explore **the Jewel at Changi Airport**, a nature-themed entertainment and retail complex on the landside of Changi Airport, Singapore. Linked to three of its passenger terminals, the centerpiece is the world's tallest indoor waterfall, named the Rain Vortex, which is surrounded by a terraced forest setting. After that, we will transfer to our hotel. Tonight, we can have our own dinner at **Hawker Centre** Singapore, an open-air complex. Return to hotel after our own dinner.

**Day 17\*\*Nov 13**

**Singapore**

**(B, L)**

After breakfast, we visit **Gardens by the Bay**. We don't want to miss **Supertree Grove**, where we'll find a cluster of iconic, futuristic structures designed to perform environmentally sustainable functions. Then, head to the **Cloud Forest Dome** to see the world's tallest indoor waterfall and learn a bit about biodiversity. Next on the list is the **Merlion Park**, to enjoy the impressive views of Marina Bay. Do not miss out on a picture-taking opportunity with The Merlion, a mythological creature that is part lion and part fish. Explore the **Civic District** of the city, passing by the Padang, Cricket Club, historic Parliament House, Supreme Court, and City Hall. Then, we will visit **Chinatown** and **Thian Hock Keng Temple**, one of Singapore's oldest Buddhist-Taoist temples. After lunch, we can enjoy some free time on our own.

**Day 18\*\*Nov 14**

**Singapore → Narita → Honolulu**

**(B)**

In the morning, transfer to the airport. We will take a flight back to Honolulu via Narita, taking home lasting memories of a magnificent vacation.
