### **Day 1\*\*Dec 1 Honolulu → Tokyo**

We start our adventure by boarding an international flight to **Tokyo**, the capital city of Japan, and one of the most populous metropolitan areas in the world. Meals and snacks will be served on the plane.

### **Day 2\*\*Dec 2 Tokyo**

Upon arrival at Tokyo International Airport, an Air & Sea Travel representative will greet us and escort us to our hotel in Tokyo.

### **Day 3\*\*Dec 3 Tokyo (B)**

After breakfast, we will visit **Tsukiji Market**, the largest wholesale market for fresh fish, fruits, and vegetables in central Tokyo. Over ten warehouses serve as the distribution centers for food products. Handling 2000 tons

of marine products every day, it has become one of the world's largest fish markets. We can enjoy our own lunch here. After that, we will go to **Tokyo Skytree** is a broadcasting, restaurant, and **observation tower** in Tokyo and the tallest structure in Japan. Then, we will go to **Harajuku**, the most popular shopping district for younger generation in Tokyo, is the center of Japan's most extreme teenage cultures and fashion styles, but also offers shopping for adults and some historic sites. Daiso Harajuku (100 Yen Shop), one of the largest 100 Yen Shops in central Tokyo, offers a wide array of goods, including clothing, kitchenware, food and stationery on four floors at 100 yen per item. **Meiji Shrine** is a shrine dedicated to the deified spirits of Emperor Meiji and his consort, Empress Shoken. During December, there is a special event is held here. Christmas is a season for family, and especially lovers in Japan. **The Tokyo Christmas Market** is one of the most extravagant ones in Japan. Stalls and shops will open; from handmade holiday ornaments to hot chocolate, beer and Christmas workshops, this market is perfect for the holiday season. There will also be live performances, like choir from Germany. Tonight, we can spend our time shopping here and also enjoy our own dinner.

#### Day 4\*\*Dec 4

#### Tokyo

(B)

After breakfast, we will go to **Senso-ji**, an ancient Buddhist temple located in Asakusa, Taito, Tokyo. It is Tokyo's oldest and one of its most significant temples. The temple is dedicated to the bodhisattva Kannon (Avalokitesvara). Dominating the entrance to the temple is the Kaminarimon or "Thunder Gate". This imposing Buddhist structure features a massive paper lantern dramatically painted in vivid red-and-black tones to suggest thunderclouds and lightning. Beyond the Kaminarimon is Nakamise-dori with its shops, followed by the Hōzōmon or "Treasure House Gate" which provides the entrance to the inner complex. Within the precincts stand **A Stately Five-story Pagoda** and the Main Hall, devoted to Kannon Bosatsu. Catering to the visiting crowds, the surrounding area has many traditional shops and eating places that feature traditional dishes (hand-made noodles, sushi, tempura, etc.). These shops themselves are part of a living tradition of selling things to pilgrims who walked to Senso-ji. Then, we will visit **Ameyoko Shopping Street**. It is a busy market street along the Yamanote Line tracks between Okachimachi and Ueno stations. Today, products such as clothes, bags, cosmetics, fresh fish, dried food, and spices are sold along Ameyoko. Edo furin wind chimes have been crafted in Japan since the Edo period. We will have a chance to try our hand at **creating or designing our own Furin**. At the end, we will visit Oi Racecourse for the **Tokyo Mega Illumination**. It's the biggest illumination event in Tokyo and themed around "the past, present, and future." In here, we can have photo taken with an adorable miniature pony, travel back in time and enjoy light displays modeled on the Edo, Meiji, Taisho, and Showa periods in Japanese history, enjoy a delicious matcha green tea flavored tiramisu and watch an amazing projection mapping display.

#### Day 5\*\*Dec 5

#### Tokyo – Lake Kawaguchi

(B, L, D)

After breakfast, we will transfer to **Lake Kawaguchi**, a hot spring resort town with various tourist attractions and views of Mount Fuji is located around the lake's eastern end, while the northern and western shores are mostly undeveloped. First, we will board the **Kawaguchi Boat**, a popular attraction on Lake Kawaguchi, offering scenic boat rides with stunning views of the surrounding mountains and the iconic Mount Fuji. **Oshino Hakkai**, a small village in the Fuji Five Lake region, located between Lake Kawaguchiko and Lake Yamanakako on the site of a former sixth lake that dried out several hundred years ago. The eight ponds are fed by snow melt from the slopes of nearby Mount Fuji that filters down the mountain through porous layers of lava for over 80 years, resulting in very clear spring water that is revered by the locals. Then, we will transfer to **Iyashi no Sato** (いやしの里), stands on the site of a former farming village on the western shores of Lake Saiko. The village was destroyed by a landslide during a typhoon in 1966. Forty years later the village's traditional thatched roofed houses were reconstructed and reopened as an open air museum and traditional craft village where people can learn about the culture and try out and purchase different local handicrafts. After a full day of sightseeing, we will go to our **Natural Hotel Spring Ryokan** to relax and enjoy the evening.

**Day 6\*\*Dec 6** **Lake Kawaguchi – Tokyo** **(B, L)**

After breakfast, we make our way to **Mt. Fuji** - we will ascend to the **5th Station** at an elevation of 7,500 feet above sea level. (We will visit **Mt. Fuji World Heritage Centre** instead of the 5<sup>th</sup> station, if weather is not permitted). After lunch, we will return to Tokyo. Upon arrival, we will enjoy the rest of the day on our own.

**Day 7\*\*Dec 7** **Tokyo** **(B)**

Full day free at leisure. You can visit Tokyo's most famous upscale market shopping, dining and entertainment district – **The Ginza**, featuring numerous department stores, boutiques, art galleries, restaurants, night clubs and cafes. Or you can enjoy a shopping day at **Shinjuku**, Tokyo's most vibrant commercial center, with many alleys, nooks, and crannies. Nearby, **Shibuya** is a center for fashion and culture, and its streets are the birthplace to many of Japan's fashion and entertainment trends.

**Day 8\*\*Dec 8** **Tokyo → Honolulu** **(B)**

After breakfast, we can explore this busy city on our own before check-out our hotel. In the afternoon, we will stop at **Costco** for last minutes shopping. After that, we will transfer to Haneda Airport for our return flight to Honolulu, taking with us the lasting memories of this wonderful Christmas Shopping Tour.
